COURT APPOINTMENT OF ADMINISTRATOR FOR JOSIAS PAWHEAGUE'S ESTATE

At a Probate Court held in Stonington, on May 5th, 1783

This Court hath appointed Captain Phineas Stanton of Stonington [to serve as] Administrator on the Intestate Estate of Josias Pawheague [PAW-HEEG], Indian, deceased. Letter granted and bonds taken on the law directs.

PAYMENTS OWED TO JOSIAS PAWHEAGUE

24 pounds, 1 shilling, 7 pence before 1780

3 pounds, 0 shillings, 11 pence ration

13 pounds, 15 shillings, 6 pence in 1781

Sum: 40 pounds, 18 shillings, 0 pence

Nota bene: Examine if there be anything due for the 3 months to be advanced in January 1781

[This last note can be omitted. It is simply a reminder to check if anything was owed before Jan. 1781, so if it's confusing, just remove the nota bene.]

FYI or trivia: This payment calculation is correct. There are 12 pence in 1 shilling.]

Stonington, May 8th, 1783
